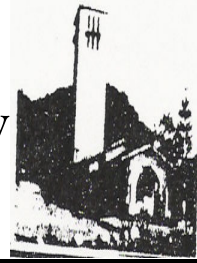

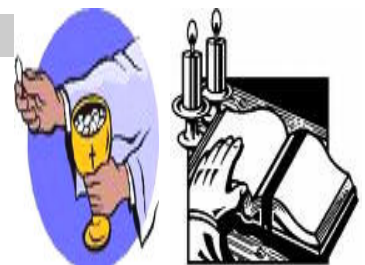

## REFLECTIONS for 2009

The year began with a bang as *Immaculee Ilibagiza*, renown author and inspirational speaker visited the parish. The Adult Faith Formation Committee, organized and hosted this event. A first for the parish and it brought people from all over the North Shore into contact with our Faith community. The response to her talk and her presence with us was remarkable! Different parishioners hosted Immaculee and her family and the welcome accorded her by our parishioners, was heartwarming. It was her first time to meet some of her family members after the Rwandan Holocaust. This made it even more special for her.

The "*Taste of St. Michael*" which brought parishioners into the School May Day was a real hit. Parents, visitors and students were ecstatic to see the many, many different local and international dishes being served. It was a School fundraiser which brought in over \$7,000. The Parish Council asked Carol Medeiros to organize the event—and she did so superbly. More parishioners are asking how we can do this again. Thank you Parish Council and Carol, and in particular the Parishioners who cooked their hearts out!!! So this is a must for 2010!

The *Parish Pilgrimage* led by Larry Sandbo and the Adult Faith Formation team was another first. Some 60 parishioners touched down on Molokai and for a weekend went back in time - to rediscover the very special place that gave us Saint Damien. It was particularly moving being down in Kaulapapa where we visited his grave, walked the dusty roads of agony, celebrated Mass in one of his churches (St. Francis), and gained a deep respect for who he was, what he did, and what he continues to mean for us on the Spiritual Journey. We are deeply grateful to Franciscan Sister Alicia Damien Lau, OSF. Her gracious assistance left a lasting impression on the group. There have been many parishioners asking whether we will be doing this again and the Adult Faith Formation Team are looking into this for 2010.

The *Religious Education Confirmation* had their first retreat that was run by the Youth and Young adult leaders. Thirty confirmation students found themselves submerged into a retreat led by their older sisters and brothers in the faith. It is truly a sign of a parish worshipping community coming into its own, when we are able to minister to our younger and emerging members. It was a blessing to see Nichole, Kanani, Josh, Geena, Nara, Jeremy - witness their faith journey to the confirmation class. They say that the first group that we model after are our peers. The witness of the Youth and Young adult leaders was powerful! We thank them - Carol, Marie, Susan, Sr. CC, Angela, Teo, Mason and the many who supported with music and prayers for our young. Because of this first retreat done with our young leaders, those who made the retreat are keen to lead the next group.

The *Canonization of St. Damien*, was certainly a highlight. We were represented in Rome by Fr. Johnathan, Sam and Marie Deuz (Parish Council Chair), Deanna Arcchi (School Principal), Jeremy Sabugo (Young Adult) and a number of other parishioners. The live feed broadcast provided an opportunity for parishioners to come together and join in the excitement.

A new committee *Social Justice* was formed out of the Adult Faith Formation. Spearheaded by Irma Sandbo, Trudy Rego and Donna Rosa, this committee has responded to the needs of our homeless families on the North Shore. The Committee works hand in hand with Alohalinda and our Outreach ministry. The parishioners have committed to assisting with the once a month meals and other services provided to the homeless. By directly reaching out to the poor and less fortunate, we are doing what Jesus has called us to do, and are also becoming more and more His disciples. This is a quiet endeavor and the sense of purpose it has instilled in the parishioners, is profound.

While these are some of the highlights, the true highlight is the parish coming together, sharing in the rich faith that we have inherited, and reaching out to ensure that this renewed faith is lived! Thank you to each and everyone of you the parishioners—the many different organizations, FCC, AFF, Outreach, Social Justice, The Choirs, Hospitality, Youth and Young adults, Sacred Hearts, Religious Education and our very special St. Michael School. We are so very blessed for having each one of you. May 2010 be a continuation of the Blessings bestowed from Above. HAPPY NEW YEAR!!
