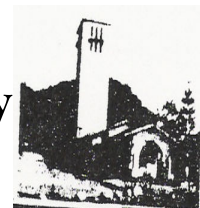

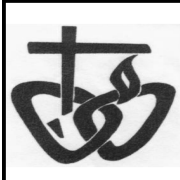

In today's first reading, Saint Peter addresses the deep division that existed between the circumcised believers and the Gentiles, the uncircumcised, who had received the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Placing Christ at the center of the dispute became the answer and, in a bold, wise, and prophetic step, Peter orders that the Gentiles be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Today's readings give us much to ponder as we try to understand why religious and cultural differences sometimes erupt in acts of violence and terrorism.

MEANINGS OF CARNATIONS

Primary Significance: With a history covering over 2,000 years, not only one of the world's oldest flowers, it has a rich history throughout its most popular varieties, but are many meanings of carnations, but the most widely accepted are fascination, distinction, and love.



Like many other flowers, different messages can also be expressed with the flower's different color varieties. Light red carnations, for example, are often used to convey admiration, whereas the dark red variety version expresses deeper sentiments of love and affection. White carnations are associated with purity and love, and pink carnations are often given as a sign of gratitude. In the early part of the 20th century, carnations became the official flower of Mother's Day ~ thus our giving of the carnations on Mother's Day to all our mothers, grandmothers, and mothers-to-be.

DAMIEN PRINT FOR SALE

Celebrated Big Island artist Dietrich Varez has created a new block print of Father Damien celebrating his canonization on October 11, 2009 in Rome. The artwork, rich in detail and symbolism in typical Varez fashion, shows angels presenting the missionary to Molokai with a halo made of maile. The reproductions are 11"x14", brown ink printed on light tan paper.



Varez has given Bishop Larry Silva permission to produce the image and offer reproductions for sale. Proceeds from the sale of the reproductions will help pay for Damien canonization-related expenses in Hawaii including the travel costs for Kalaupapa patients who want to attend the ceremonies in Belgium and Rome.
