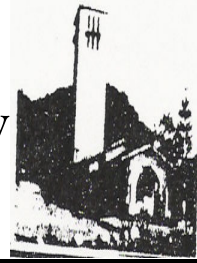

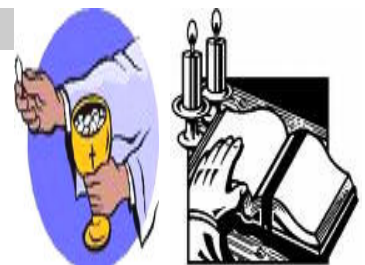

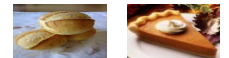
Mass will be given at St. Michael and at Mission of Sts. Peter & Paul on morning, November 26, at 8:00 AM, along with the Blessing of the Bread.
