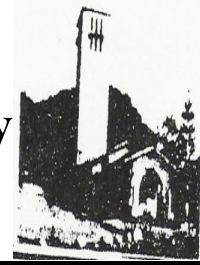

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: For those who suffer from serious illness or before surgery, call the Rectory Office.

HOMEBOUND: For the aged, sick or homebound who wishes to receive Holy Eucharist, call the Rectory Office or Priscilla Tampon at 293-2753.

WANT MARRIAGE BLESSED? Highly recommended if marriage not celebrated in the Church. Call the Rectory office or see the priest.

ADVENT begins four Sundays before Christmas and ends after Mid-afternoon Prayer on Christmas Eve.

For so many thousands of years people had been waiting. The prophet Isaiah spoke of this waiting when he wrote: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light" (Isaiah 9:1). God's people knew that this Great Light would dawn. During the season of Advent, which means "coming", we remember the people who waited in joyful hope for the coming of the Light. We also pray for the light of Jesus to be born anew in our hearts. With the whole Church, we wait for the celebration of Christmas, but also for that day called *Parousia*, when the light of Christ will fill all people and enlighten the whole cosmos.

Each Sunday of Advent, we light one candle and remember Jesus Christ, who is the Great Light that continues to grow and spread in the world.
