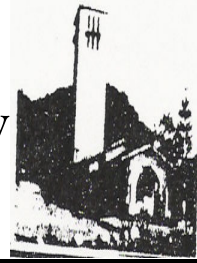

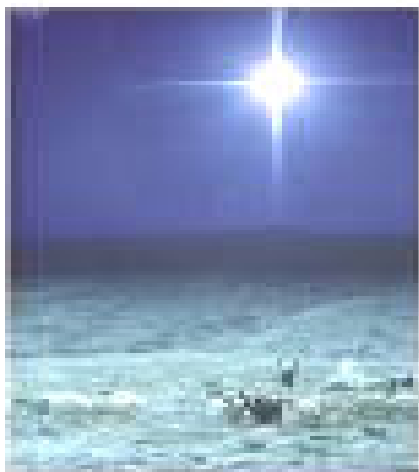

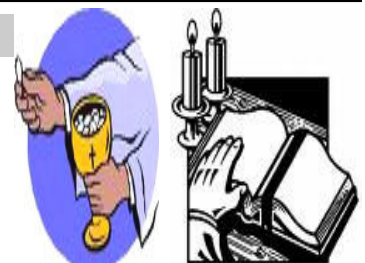

This has become a great need in our parish. We will have sign-up sheets available for families and groups to clean either St. Michael or Sts. Peter & Paul in the New Year.

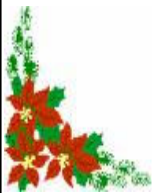
